At Families First, you have access to an entire team of health care and family services professionals, including physicians, nurse practitioners, dentists, a nutritionist, behavioral health specialists, registered nurses (including some certified in management of chronic illnesses), parent educators, home visitors, social workers, and child care providers.

## Health Services at Families First

These health services are open to everyone, regardless of ability to pay or insurance status. (See page 11 for insurance plans we accept and options for people who don't have insurance.) Most services have no geographic restrictions. We can also help patients get access to prescription drugs and enroll in benefits programs. Our physicians can admit patients to Portsmouth Regional Hospital.

### Because you can't be healthy if your mouth isn't, we offer **on-site Dental Care**

The Dental Center provides **on-site dental hygiene, restorative and emergency oral health care**, as well as oral health education and care coordination. Families First Dental Center is open to:

- All children and teens living in NH or Maine, with or without insurance, who do not have a dentist.
- Established patients of Families First Health Center.
- Clients of Steppingstones and AIDS Response Seacoast.

### We'll come to you, with **Mobile Health Care for the Homeless**

Health care teams travel on vans to different places in the Seacoast region, providing medical services, social work services and substance abuse counseling. (For a schedule of sites, call **1-888-922-0005** or visit our web site.) Anyone living in temporary or transitional housing is welcome. Patients pay nothing; insurance will be billed if the patient has it, and we will help with benefits enrollment. **603-422-8208 ext. 129**

## General Medical Care *for everyone*

- Provided by family practice and internal medicine physicians and nurse practitioners, and a pediatric nurse practitioner
- Preventive care, including immunizations for children
- Fast access to appointments when you or your child is sick
- Access to a nutritionist, licensed mental health and drug-and-alcohol counselors, behavioral health specialist, child development specialist, certified diabetes and asthma educators, and home visitors
- Group-visit program for diabetics
- EKG and lung-function testing and drawing of lab samples
- Breast and cervical cancer screenings (free, if eligible)
- Electronic medical records to promote better quality and continuity of care

## Enjoy adult time, add to your parenting toolkit, and get support at **Parenting Classes and Groups**

**Parenting classes** help parents understand child behavior, have reasonable expectations and learn positive ways to discipline children. Class topics include *Keeping Your Cool*, *Effective Discipline*, *How to Talk So Kids Will Listen*, *Co-Parenting*, *Living With Teens* and many more.

**Parent groups** let parents have some “grownup” time. While we take care of the kids, you’ll relax and share ideas, resources, and strategies for parenting.



Most programs are free and include free child care, with dinner for kids during evening programs. To make sure your child has a spot in **child care**, sign up in advance.

## Ways We Make It Easy to Use Our Services

### Accessibility

Families First's building is fully accessible to people with disabilities. If you need a wheelchair or other assistance getting from your car into the building, please call ahead.

### Free Child Care

Families First has a nurturing, educational child care program where children play and learn in a beautiful Children's Room adjoining a small playground. Care is provided for children up to age 12 *while their parent or guardian is attending a program or appointment* at Families First or certain other programs at the Community Campus. If you will need child care during an appointment, ask to be scheduled for a time when child care is available (usually Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings). Then, call the Family Center (422-8208 ext. 2) to reserve a place in child care for your child. Please do not bring your child if he or she is ill.

### Interpreters/Translation

If you need translation during your visit to Families First, please tell us at least three days in advance. If possible, we will provide you with a translator; if not, we may arrange for translation over a language phone line. To arrange for translation, call (603) 422-8208 ext. 142 (for Health Services) or ext. 125 (for Family Services).

### Transportation

Trolley service to the Community Campus is available from many locations in Portsmouth. For route and schedule information, call (603) 743-5777 or visit [www.coastbus.org](http://www.coastbus.org), click on **COAST Trolley**, and then see the **Lafayette Road Trolley Schedule**. The trolley stops at the Campus only on the outbound (southbound) portion of the route.

If you do not live on the COAST trolley route but do live in Portsmouth, we may be able to help you to get here. Please call 422-8208 ext. 1 (if you are coming here for Health Services) or ext. 125 (if you are coming for Family Services).

## Insurance Accepted & Help for Uninsured

Families First provides medical and dental care for both insured and uninsured patients.

### Insurance plans Accepted for *Medical Care*

- Maine Medicaid (not accepted for prenatal care)
- NH Healthy Kids (Gold and Silver)
- Medicare

Families First will bill any medical insurance carrier even if not listed above. However, patients are responsible for verifying with the carrier that Families First is a covered network provider and for covering any out-of-network expenses.

### If You're Uninsured or Have Insurance with a High Deductible

If you or your child are eligible for Medicaid or NH Healthy Kids, we will help you apply for coverage.

If you are not eligible for these programs, we encourage you to apply for Families First's sliding fee scale, which has three levels of adjusted fees based on your income. Uninsured or underinsured patients who qualify for the sliding fee scale can receive a discount on medical services and supplies.

If you don't wish to apply for the sliding fee scale, or if your income is too high for you to qualify, you must pay the full fee. Payment plans are available.

## Other Things You Should Know

### Privacy and Confidentiality

Families First will *never* share personal or medical information about you with anyone who is not on the staff of Families First without your written permission. Families First may contact you by phone, mail or email to invite you to try different Families First programs and services, but will not share your contact information with any outside organization.

Families First complies with the federal Health Information Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), including the provision that, “To make sure that your information is protected in a way that does not interfere with your healthcare, your information can be used and shared for your treatment and care coordination.” More information about this law is available at the Health Center.

**Family Center office:** Monday through Friday, 8:30 to 4:30\*

**Health Center telephones/front office:** Mon.-Fri., 8:30 to 5:00\*

**Health Center appointments scheduled:** Mon.-Fri., 8:00 to 5:00\*

In addition, parenting and family programs are often offered in the early evening, and occasionally on weekends. Appointments may be available early evenings, as well as some Saturdays (dental only).

*\*Note: Offices are closed on Wednesdays from noon to 1:30 or 2:00.*

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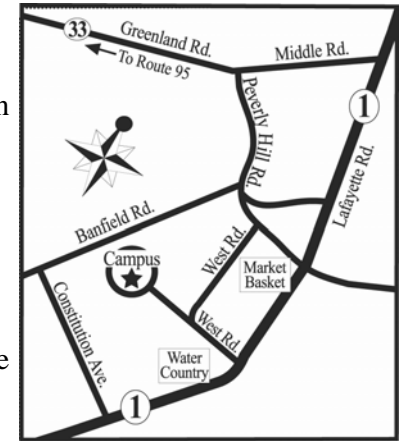

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## Driving Directions (see page 10 for other transportation info)

Families First is located at the Community Campus in Portsmouth, just north of Water Country, less than half a mile west of Route 1.

### From Route 16 or I-95:

- Follow signs to Route 1 South in Portsmouth. They will take you to the Portsmouth Traffic Circle.
- Exit the Traffic Circle onto Route 1 South.
- Follow next set of directions.



### From the Portsmouth Traffic Circle:

- Take Route 1 South (a.k.a. Lafayette Road) for about 2.8 miles. On your right, you will pass Market Basket and, later, Service Credit Union.
- Shortly after Service Credit Union, look on the right for a green COMMUNITY CAMPUS sign (may be blocked by trees).
- Turn Right at the sign, onto West Road.
- Follow “From West Road” directions, below.

### From Route 1, south of Portsmouth:

- Take Route 1 North into Portsmouth.
- Just after passing Water Country on your left, you will see a green COMMUNITY CAMPUS sign on your left. Turn Left at the sign, onto West Road. Follow next set of directions.

### From West Road

- Follow West Road. At the STOP sign, go straight. Shortly after the STOP sign, you will come to a small roundabout at the entrance to the Community Campus. Go through the roundabout and follow the drive into the Campus.
- Follow the road around the building, all the way to the end. Park in one of the rear lots. Enter at door next to small playground.
